Spring 2020
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Implementation Plan

This semester you will create an implementation plan for a program to address a public problem. As we explore different facets of public administration, this plan will serve as a way to apply your increased understanding of public administration while learning from each other about different ways to look at public problems that are interesting to you.

Some components will use specific formats to help you practice different ways to convey information in a public organization.

This project is about using the material we have used in class to apply to your public problem. For each part of the project, you will explain that area in a way that relates to that topic area. This creative project complements our three in class reflections as a way to think about public administration in a creative way hopefully related to an issue you care about.

The implementation plan project is organized into seven parts that are due periodically. To that end, some parts of the plan are purposefully short. In government, an analyst or project manager will often have to very briefly explain why a problem is worth solving to share. Maximizing the use of small space (as well as limiting how much time you will be working) are important.

Consider the following when crafting your responses

- Does this answer the question in the prompt?
- Does this rely on any supporting sources?
- Are their concepts from the readings or class that could support this?

Each part will be due on Moodle in a word document. When appropriate, I will print them.

Please use normal margins and 12pt font, single-spaced.

The whole package will be finally due on exam day. There is no need to worry about the look of this implementation plan for this class, but you may want to add a title page when submitting at the end.

I will be grading these as I receive them.

If 7/9 parts are completed on the date appropriate for class, I will add 5 points to your final grade for this assignment. I reserve the right to follow up with you if I haven't received a part when it is initially due.

Public Problems

You will write a brief memo describing a public problem that you believe can be solved by government action. We will discuss different types of problems that a government solves in class and you will pick one from the group that we select.

- Who needs to be involved in the implementation of this program?
- Should members of the public be involved?
- What efforts might you use to engage the stakeholders?

Part 3 - 2/18/2020

Ethical Implications (3 pages max)

- Does this problem reside in an area where there is a professional code for ethical behavior?
- What types of values might be needed for this project?
- What types of concerns about ethical behavior might you be interested in?
